This month we take a closer look at 'Support for Accessing Education and Formal Learning'

Formal learning is structured training that enables you to expand your knowledge, skills, and abilities. It often comes in an instructor-led course, workshop, seminar, or training session with clear objectives and goals.








AccessAbilityInclusive Musgraves




Background




