

In having choice and control in her everyday life, Claire Middleton from Mulberry Day Service has completed her Travel Training and now takes the bus independently to Islandbridge and back.




Blind Date Event

The format of the night was Disco, Blind Date sessions and Spot Prize giveaway which were alternated throughout the night.






